Wednesday Jan 1	Genesis 1:1-3:24	Service: Reflect on God's act of creation and His provision for humanity. Serve someone today by mirroring God's care—whether through a kind deed, offering help, or creating something that blesses others.
Thursday Jan 2	Genesis 4:1–5:32 1 Chronicles 1:1–4 Genesis 6:1–22	Prayer: Pray over the story of Noah's obedience to God's commands. Thank God for His faithfulness and ask for His guidance in walking in obedience in your own life.
Friday Jan 3	Genesis 7:1–9:29	Study: Examine the details of the flood account. What does this passage reveal about God's justice and mercy? Take notes on how God preserves life and fulfills His promises.
Saturday Jan 4	Genesis 10:1-5 Genesis 10:21-11:26 1 Chronicles 1:5-7 1 Chronicles 1:17-27 Genesis 10:6-20 1 Chronicles 1:8-16	Journal: Reflect on the genealogy and the spread of nations after the flood. Write about how you see God's sovereignty and plan unfolding in this passage. Consider how this connects to your own family story and God's work in your life.



WEEK 2	DAILY READING	DAILY PRACTICE
Sunday Jan 5	Job 1:1-3:26	Worship: Worship God for His justice and mercy. Consider listening to or singing a song about trusting God during trials (e.g., "Blessed Be Your Name").
Monday Jan 6	Job 4:1-7:21	Memorization: Commit Job 6:10 to memory: "Then I would still have this consolation—my joy in unrelenting pain—that I had not denied the words of the Holy One."
Tuesday Jan 7	Job 8:1-10:22	Solitude: Seek a quiet place to process Job's questions and your own reflections on suffering.
Wednesday Jan 8	Job 11:1-14:22	Generosity: Reflect on how Job's friends interacted with him and strive to offer grace and understanding to others.
Thursday Jan 9	Job 15:1-18:21	Fasting: Fast from something that distracts you from connecting with God, focusing on His justice and mercy.
Friday Jan 10	Job 19:1-21:34	Meditation: Meditate on Job 19:25: "I know that my redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand on the earth."
Saturday Jan 11	Job 22:1-26:14	Celebration: Celebrate God's greatness through a creative activity or sharing a joyful moment with someone.



WEEK 3	DAILY READING	DAILY PRACTICE
Sunday Jan 12	Job 27:1-29:25	Sabbath: Rest in the assurance that God knows your heart. Reflect on Job's righteousness and perseverance.
Monday Jan 13	Job 30:1-31:40	Gratitude: Thank God for His guidance in helping you live a life of integrity, as Job strived to do.
Tuesday Jan 14	Job 32:1-34:37	Silence: Spend time listening to God's wisdom, as Elihu encourages Job to do in today's reading.
Wednesday Jan 15	Job 35:1-37:24	Service: Offer kindness to someone today as a reminder of God's care for all creation.
Thursday Jan 16	Job 38:1-39:30	Prayer: Pray through Job 38:4-11, praising God for His wisdom and creative power.
Friday Jan 17	Job 40:1-42:17	Study: Watch this overview on the book of Job to learn more about how Job comes into play in the Bible as a whole: bibleproject.com/explore/video/wisdom-job/
Saturday Jan 18	Genesis 11:27-15:21	Journal: Write about how God's promises to Abram show His faithfulness to His people and plans.



WEEK 4	DAILY READING	DAILY PRACTICE
Sunday Jan 19	Genesis 16:1–18:33	Worship: Reflect on God's promise to Abraham and Sarah and His faithfulness. Praise Him for His ability to bring life and hope into impossible situations. Consider singing or listening to a song about God's faithfulness (e.g., "Great Is Thy Faithfulness").
Monday Jan 20	Genesis 19:1-21:34 Genesis 25:12-18 1 Chronicles 1:28-31	Memorization: Commit Genesis 28:15 (Friday's reading) to memory: "I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land. I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." Reflect on how memorizing God's Word can reinforce your faith in His promises.
Tuesday Jan 21	Genesis 22:1-24:67	Solitude: Spend time alone reflecting on Abraham's faith and obedience in Genesis 22. Ask God to reveal areas where you need to trust Him more deeply.
Wednesday Jan 22	Genesis 25:1-4 Genesis 25:19-26 1 Chronicles 1:32-34 Genesis 25:7-11 Genesis 25:5-6 Genesis 25:27-26:35 1 Chronicles 1:34	Generosity: Reflect on how Abraham gave gifts to his other sons while leaving the inheritance to Isaac (Genesis 25:5-6). Consider how you can be generous with your time, resources, or encouragement today.
Thursday Jan 23	Genesis 27:1-28:9 Genesis 36:1-43 1 Chronicles 1:35-54	Fasting: Skip a meal or fast from a distraction as you meditate on God's plan despite Jacob's deception in Genesis 27. Ask for clarity on areas in your life where you need to submit fully to God's will.
Friday Jan 24	Genesis 28:10-30:43	Meditation: Focus on Genesis 28:15: "I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go." Meditate on God's promise to Jacob and how He is present with you in your journey.
Saturday Jan 25	Genesis 31:1–32:32	Celebration: Reflect on how Jacob reconciled with Laban and prepared to face Esau. Celebrate moments of reconciliation and God's provision in your own life by sharing a joyful activity or a special meal with others.



WEEK 5	DAILY READING	DAILY PRACTICE
Sunday Jan 26	Genesis 33:1–35:29 1 Chronicles 2:1–2	Sabbath: Reflect on Jacob's reconciliation with Esau and God's faithfulness in fulfilling His promises. Rest in the peace that comes from trusting God with relationships and the future.
Monday Jan 27	Genesis 37:1–39:23	Gratitude: Reflect on how God's presence was with Joseph, even in challenging circumstances. Write down three things you are thankful for today, focusing on God's faithfulness in difficult seasons.
Tuesday Jan 28	Genesis 40:1-41:57	Silence: Spend 10-15 minutes in quiet reflection, considering how God worked through Joseph's interpretation of Pharaoh's dreams. Ask God to speak to you about how He might be at work in your life right now.
Wednesday Jan 29	Genesis 42:1-44:34	Service: Consider how Joseph's service to his brothers reflected God's grace. Perform an act of kindness or serve someone in need today, reflecting the love and forgiveness of God.
Thursday Jan 30	Genesis 45:1–46:9 1 Chronicles 5:1–6 Genesis 46:10–12 1 Chronicles 2:18–55	Prayer: Pray through Genesis 45:4–8, reflecting on Joseph's perspective of God's providence. Thank God for His sovereignty and pray for a heart that seeks His purposes in every situation.
Friday Jan 31	1 Chronicles 4:1-23 1 Chronicles 7:30-40 Genesis 46:13 Genesis 46:19-25 1 Chronicles 7:1-5 1 Chronicles 7:6-12 Genesis 46:14-18 Genesis 46:26-47:12	Study: Go to https://bibleproject.com/articles/chronicle s-not-just-repeat/ and read about why the book of Chronicles are valuable even though they often duplicate what is written in other books of the bible.
Saturday Feb 1	Genesis 47:13–50:26	Journal: Reflect on Joseph's forgiveness of his brothers and his faith in God's plans (Genesis 50:19-21). Write about how God's sovereignty has been evident in your life, even in difficult circumstances.
